



bring solutions. So, we stop ourselves from taking that first small step.














ETHICS & ROTARY

Paul Harris argued that there was no need to feel quilty about making a profit if you did so by providing a good product or service at a fair price. In fact, being ethical in business is such a wise business practice that, in time, those less inclined to ethical behavior will be forced to change their ways in order to compete with you.

AY's evening at the theatre










