

IMAGINE ROTARY

SEEING WHAT ISN'T THERE is a power that only humans possess. The source of human power is neither muscle nor mind but models. I had made a reference to mental models in one of my earlier pieces in this bulletin.

TO FRAME IS TO MAKE A MENTAL MODEL THAT ENABLES US TO SEE PATTERNS, PREDICT HOW THINGS WILL UNFOLD AND UNDERSTAND NEW SITUATIONS. Frames guide our decisions and the results that we attain. Some of the greatest breakthroughs in humanity have been achieved through framing. How the Wright brothers, with no formal physics training gave us the first flight with exemplary framing. How deploying the # MeToo hashtag on Twitter reframed the perception of sexual assault from shame to empowerment.

It is my view that framing is not just a way to improve how we make decisions in the era of computers and algorithms but will be a matter of survival for humanity in a time of

social upheaval and machine prosperity. We can turn framing from a basic feature of human cognition into a practical tool that we can use to make better decisions.

Framing is so fundamental to human cognition that even those who study the workings of human mind started focusing on it only recently. Most of the work was looking at the importance of sensing and memory but as people have become more aware of the need to improve decision making the role of frames which aids choices and action has become centre stage.

There is no such thing as a "bad" frame but there are surelu cases of misframing. In 2008. Nokia led the world in mobile phones and when Apple introduced the iPhone, few thought that it would take off Nokia's frame came from the conservative telecom industry whereas Apple came from breathlessly innovative computing industry that valued ease of use despite being pricier. The Apple frame turned out to be a better fit for consumer needs and it now dominates the market

A human mind can see the world not as it exists but

as it can be. We do this by understanding, rejecting or accepting frames. **THE FRONTIERS OF OUR IMAGINATION ARE THE BOUNDARIES OF OUR WORLD. HUMANITY IS NOT LOCKED INTO ONE REALITY BUT CAN ENJOY ANY IT DECIDES TO**

CREATE. The power is within us, by how we can conceive of and conceptualise our world and lives – all that we are and all that we hope to be. We thrive through co-operation but we will survive only as framers.

Sessions on basic legal awareness and government schemes were delivered by Mr. Satish Hiwale, Secretary, Mumbai Suburban District Legal Services Authority. The programme was coordinated by Aileen Marques, Panel Advocate of Mumbai Suburban District Legal Services Authority.

At the first session on November 2nd, 2022, at 11 am at the Dr. E. Moses Road, Worli centre, about 70 women senior citizens participated. The *aajis* found the session informative and they were happy to interact with Mr. Hiwale, a judicial officer.

The second session on November 3rd, 2022, at Byculla East at 3 pm, was attended by about 80 women senior citizens. The women listened patiently to session and asked their questions.

The third session on November 4th, 2022 at Mazgaon, saw the participation of about 55 women senior citizens and four male senior citizens. Quite a few participants brought their documents and sought legal advice from Mr. Hiwale and Adv. Aileen Marques.

There was a request from the participants to arrange educational visits to the local police station and courts. Accordingly, visits to three local police stations were planned.

We thank PN Satyan Israni for arranging these legal awareness sessions and police station visits for the senior citizens of the Ananda Yaan Centres.

Later last week, 12 women including senior citizens, visited Kalachowkie Police Station to understand the functioning of the police station.

New RCB dialysis centre under TRF's Global Grant

A new dialysis centre is being inaugurated in Charkop, on November 22nd, 2022, by Rotary Club of Bombay.

This dialysis centre is under the Global Grant of The Rotary Foundation in partnership with RC of Mumbai North End and RC Charlotte, USA.

This dialysis centre is supported by Mahansaria Group of our Rtn. Yogesh Mahansaria.

This is a 15-bed centre where Fresenious Kabi German dialysis machines have been installed. The project includes RO filter, beds and other moveable equipment and UPS batteries.

Dialysis will be conducted free of cost to needy patients. This centre has the best technicians, nephrologists, and nursing team, etc.

Generally, a dialysis cycle cost varies from Rs. 1000 to Rs. 2500, and a patient requires a minimum of two to three cycles a week. This results in an economic burden of nearly Rs. 12000 per month along with ancillary medication, doctor visits transportation and dietary requirements.

The new RCB Dialysis Centre is expected to provide a huge economic relief to the needy patients.

The project cost is Rs. 1.25 crore.

Healing hearts across India

Rotary Club of Bombay-CSR INDIA GRANT (Paediatric Heart Surgeries)

Every year, more than 200,000 children are born with congenital heart disease in India, barely 2%

receive optimal treatment. Even today, rural India is without the facilities required to handle such cases. So, Rotary has been funding these paediatric heart surgeries for the past few years.

Rotary Club of Bombay has signed an MOU with Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital & SRCC Childrens Hospital (both are top hospitals with world class amenities, doctors and equipment) to fund the treatment of such children.

Hospitals hold medical camps across rural India and, through them, identify the children who need this medical care. They are then referred to various NGOs including Rotary.

Our partner hospitals have extended special, reduced pricing for this noble and life-saving project without any compromise on quality. The initial follow-up, post-surgery and discharge for the patient is also at no cost to the family.

Each hospital gets patients from all over the country. This includes children from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Kashmir, and Tamil Nadu to name a few. We have identified and operated on patients as young as a few days old up to the age of 18.

HOW ROTARY CLUB OF BOMBAY HELPS:

1. Arrange preliminary screening of the children to ensure that those selected are suitable for the required surgical procedure (Open Heart Surgery).

- 2. Arrange for admission, surgery, and discharge.
- 3. Rotarians and their partners visit children at



the hospitals and help in any way needed.

All documents of each patient are screened and, after due diligence, RCB gives the go-ahead for the surgery and payment is released for the same.

We expect about 100-125 children (from newborn babies up to age 18 years) to benefit from this project. The exact number will vary depending on how many category cases are referred to us. We plan to do all category cardiac operations and paediatric cardiac interventions like ASD/ VSD/ PDS device closures and balloon dilatations.

Through this grant, RCB will help mend hearts and bridge the gap for parents who are unable to raise funds for the full cost of operation for their children.



Rotary Club of Bombay in partnership with Society for Rehabilitation of Crippled Children (SRCC) Children's Hospital and the M&MA Foundation are working towards providing lifesaving surgeries to children from Uganda suffering from congenital heart disorders.

These children belong to financially-backward families that are unable to cover medical costs including medicines and surgical interventions as well as flights and travel. RCB, along with its partners, steps in to bridge the gap and provide financial and other assistance to these families to offer lifesaving surgical interventions for children at no cost to the families. This provides the children with a second chance to live a long and healthy life.

So far, RCB has funded eight surgeries of patients from Uganda

at SRCC Children's Hospital with RCB's contribution of Rs 7,00,500/-. Each surgery was a success and patients have been discharged. Details of each patient is given above.


