A DIALOGUE WITH SEEMA TAPARIA: A JOURNEY FROM ARRANGED MARRIAGES TO NETFLIX STARDOM



Seema Taparia, matchmaker and star of Netflix's successful series, *Indian Matchmaking*, engaged in an extensive conversation with Rtn. Renu Basu last Tuesday. This discussion touched on her life, her ascension to fame, and her perspectives on marriage, love, and the evolving landscape of relationships in contemporary society.

Hailing from Gulbarga, Karnataka, Taparia was born into a prosperous Lahouti family. At the age of 19, she became part of the Mumbai-based Taparia Group of Industries through an arranged marriage - a conventional practice at the time. Taparia fondly recalled her first encounter with her husband, a brief meeting of merely 30 minutes. The families had assessed each other based on shared values, astrological compatibility, and upbringing before finalising their decision. This early experience seemingly laid the foundation for her ensuing career as a matchmaker.



In 2005, Taparia began her journey in matchmaking, capitalising on her unique ability to connect with people and understand them. This endeavour represented a significant service to her community, she felt. Her breakout moment arrived in 2010 when she was contacted by Smriti Mundhra from Los Angeles for matchmaking services. This engagement led to Taparia's feature in the award-winning documentary, 'A Suitable Girl,' which also chronicled her daughter's 2014 wedding. Subsequently, Netflix offered Taparia her own reality show, Indian Matchmaking, marking a transformative turn in her life.

Subscribing to the mantra, "A perfect marriage isn't found, it's created," Taparia attributed the difficulties in contemporary marriages to a perceived lack of core values such as giving, sharing, and loving among the younger generation. She underscored

the necessity for patience, a balance between professional and personal life, and realistic expectations in marriage.

"NO ONE EVER FINDS A 100% MATCH," SHE EMPHASISED, PROMOTING COMPROMISE, AND UNDERSTANDING.

Taparia was astonished by the international success of her Netflix series. She credited the show's triumph to an authentic depiction of her life and the family values she represents. Her sudden fame expanded her influence to 190 countries, attracting an audience ranging from those familiar with the tradition of Indian arranged marriages to those discovering it for the first time. This widespread recognition only intensified her passion for her work.

Contrasting the impersonal nature of matchmaking apps and platforms, Taparia said her personalised approach involved visiting her clients' homes to



understand their lifestyles and ascertain their preferences for a match. She staunchly defended arranged marriages as a time-tested system that had demonstrated its success over centuries, observing its resurgence among young viewers of her show.

The show's fame significantly altered Taparia's life in Mumbai. While she cherished the global admiration and respect, she acknowledged that her lifestyle had drastically changed. Now involved in brand endorsements, TV appearances, and even movie offers, Taparia strived to maintain a balance between her work and personal life. Her fondness for socialising, hosting parties, and traveling persisted, as did her value for time spent with family.

Incontestably, Taparia's life underwent a dramatic change, with her emerging as a global ambassador for traditional Indian

values. However, her primary mission stayed constant – to assist individuals in finding love and happiness through her exceptional matchmaking skills.

Comparing her matchmaking methods with the impersonal approach of dating apps such as Tinder and Bumble, Taparia stating that her hands-on, mediator role led to a higher success rate.

TAPARIA ALSO HIGHLIGHTED THE NEED FOR PATIENCE, UNDERSTANDING, COMPROMISE, AND RESPECT IN NURTURING A SUCCESSFUL RELATIONSHIP.

She shared her perspectives on arranged marriages, unique to certain cultures like India's, and expressed how she had witnessed interest in this form of matchmaking from people worldwide.

Thanks to our solar lift irrigation project, water availability ensured that people engaged in agriculture got year-round water. This enabled them to increase their income through double-crop cultivation and harvesting cash crops. However, some landless villagers did not benefit from our agricultural initiatives. We built a livelihood centre in the village to ensure that they get regular income.

DG Sandip Agarwalla and President Vineet Bhatnagar inaugurated the Rotary Livelihood Centre on June 14th, 2023. We have installed a leaf plate and oil extraction. We will also install a cashew nut processing machine soon. We are also setting up a learning centre for the village youth for agro-based industrial training. RCB plans to support the community in operations,

financial governance and marketing of the products.

DG Sandip and Vineet also inaugurated toilets for the households. **WE HAVE CONSTRUCTED 76 TOILETS, ONE FOR EACH FAMILY. THIS INITIATIVE WOULD HELP IMPROVE THE VILLAGERS' HEALTH, ESPECIALLY THE WOMEN.**

The Panchattavva committee would like to thank Rtn. Jamshed Banaji for designing and supervising the

construction of the livelihood centre (free of cost), Rtn. Dinesh Lal for sponsoring the livelihood centre and Rtn. Poonam Lalvani for the toilet construction. The numerous initiatives undertaken at Gale would not have been possible without the generous contribution of Rtn. Abhin Alimchandani. The Rotary Livelihood Centre is dedicated to the late Rtn. C.R Alimachandni.

Finally, thanks to our implementation partners, Diganta Swaraj Foundation and Rotary Club of Wada, for all their support over the last three years.

RCB celebrates Vaidu women's literacy achievement



Women from the nomadic Vaidu community in the Jogeshwari/Marol area, aged between 22 and 62, have been awarded certificates to celebrate their successful completion of a three-month Adult Literacy module. This initiative was designed by TCS and implemented by the Rotary Club of Bombay (RCB). The event, held on Sunday June 10th, 2023, was attended by DG Sandip Agarwalla, RCB President Vineet Bhatnagar, and RCB ALP Committee Chair Runit Shah.

In the Vaidu community, a minute percentage of women are literate. It's well acknowledged that a child's physical and cognitive development is directly linked to the literacy of their mother, which also contributes to the overall wellbeing of the family. Under the guidance of Rtn Ptn Ekta Shah, the RCB has carried out numerous projects within the Vaidu community.



The Adult Literacy Programme (ALP), in partnership with TCS, aims to promote and strengthen adult education amongst illiterate women of any age. The goal is to help participants reach functional literacy within 50 to 55 hours, over the course of roughly

70 sessions. Amongst other skills, learners acquire a vocabulary of about 700 words, sufficient for daily requirements such as reading bus destination signs, bank documents, and newspapers.



In addition to basic reading, writing and arithmetic, they also gain exposure to government schemes like Aadhar, Pradhan Mantri Yojanas, and more. Literacy leads to benefits like employment, upliftment for the family and society at large, better political representation for women, later marriages, smaller families, and poverty reduction.



Over the past year ending in April 2023, the Rotary Club of Bombay, in conjunction with the Anum Foundation, successfully trained and certified approximately 800 beneficiaries through 17 Prerikas from their own community. The project was completed at a cost of around Rs. 7 lakhs.

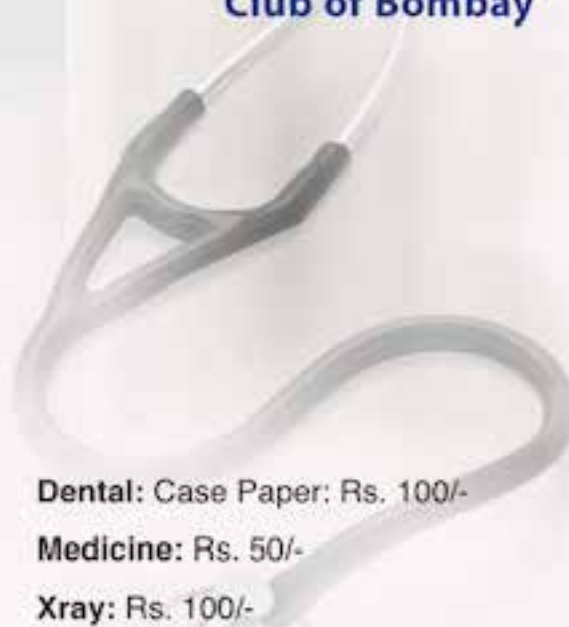
