## COTTON GREEN:

Rotary Club of Bombay is running a Charitable Clinic along with Bombay Cotton Merchants & Muccadams Association Ltd & Dr. Batra's Foundation in Cotton Green. The treatments are done free of cost. The clinic is open every Tuesday & Friday.

The homeopathic department is run by Dr. Batra's Foundation. Consultation and medicines are given free of cost.

The dental department runs in

association with the Indian Institute of Continuing Education & Research. (Rtn. Swati Mayekar).

Blood testing is done by N.M. Medical at a concessional rate. 70% cost of testing is borne by NM Medical. (Rtn. Rahil Shah)

GP and paediatric medicines are given free of cost.

Eye check-up is free of cost.

In February 2023, the clinic started a tobacco deaddiction service every Friday.

The clinic is open twice a day i.e. Tuesday and Friday.

## IWA:

The clinic at IWA is being supported by RCB since past 5 years. A new MoU was signed this July for a period of 1 year with the provision for increasing the timings/ frequency in order to get more patients. RCB's current support is Rs. 1.25 lakhs per month; the rest is being borne by IWA. For increase in timings and additional services, IWA will need to be compensated.

## Current services being offered:

General medicine, paediatrics, dental, X-ray (10 am to 4 pm daily) and gynaecology, homeopathy, dermatology and consultant physician on selected days per week.

All consultations and medicines for one week are offered for Rs. 50 only.

Dental treatment costs are highly subsidised.

Digital X-ray is offered at Rs.150 only.

In recent times, Trustee Arun Sanghi has been actively involved in helping scale up the clinic. Dermatology coverage has been expanded. Connects have been made to other Rotary medical projects / committees particularly for ophthalmology (cataract surgery), cardiac surgery, dialysis, coronary angiography, and neurology. NM Medical is also starting blood testing at 70% concession at the clinic.



## Total cost incurred in the year:

Rs. 34,02,783 which includes Rs. 5,68,204 spent on a new X-ray machine in December 2022 (paid for directly by IWA).

## (a) Action plan to carry out the planned project:

At Cotton Green, plans are underway to expand coverage of dental services by adding one more chair and also adding an alcohol deaddiction programme in collaboration with Alcoholics Anonymous. Plans are being formulated to create more awareness about the tobacco deaddiction programme.

Camps continue for Garden School which is a BMC school close by, along with 2 more schools as well as Savera which supports children with special needs.

In addition, discussions have been ongoing with the club's social workers about awareness campaign through leaflet distribution to target offices and clubs (such as Bombay Gym) in the surrounding areas as well as more schools in order to increase awareness about the services offered which are at a very reasonable rate. RCB members were also updated about the services and encouraged to send their staff to avail of the same. A special leaflet and poster has also been designed for this purpose.

The adjoining Lions Club clinic at IWA has agreed to see IWA patients for ophthalmology at subsidised rates. Also, subsidised rates are being worked out for sonography for IWA patients.

Rtn. Venkat Ramaswamy has donated Rs. 10 lakhs like every year. We wish to thank him for his support and request more donors to donate to this project.

On behalf of our Committee, we thank the President and Board of Directors for their guidance and support. We thank the Bombay Cotton Merchants & Muccadams Association and its President, Shri Shyam Makharia for their continuous support.

### Three Volumes of Environmental Science Curriculum

We have created a children's illustrated book dedicated to environmental studies in three languages – English, Hindi and Marathi to be distributed free in schools. We hope to create awareness amongst as many children as we can.

Three volumes of Environmental Science curriculum – The World is My Canvas was rolled out on October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to be disseminated to school students. It also included Hindi and Marathi versions of the three volumes.

The covers were designed by renowned sculptor and painter Arzan Khambatta.

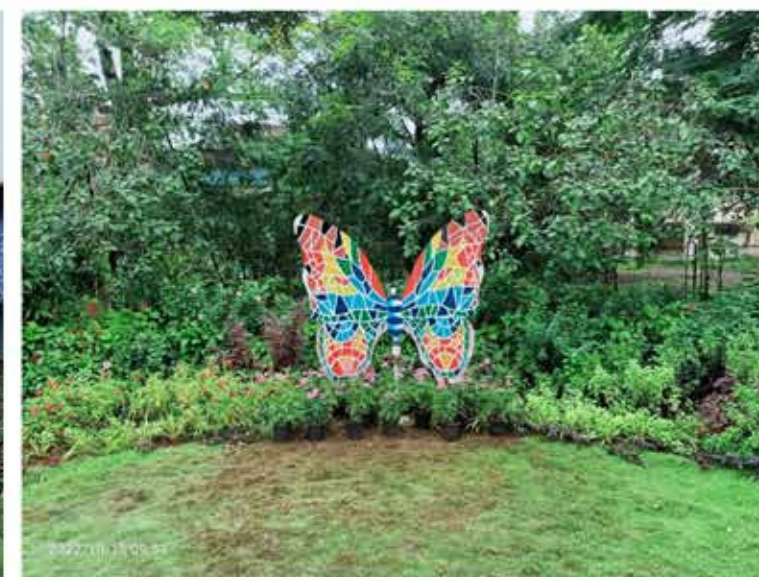
E-Modules have been uploaded on the Alpha YouTube Chanel.

First pilot of rolling out this course to over 1000 students in Palghar began post Diwali. A 'Train the Trainer' module was initiated first to equip the teachers of the schools teaching this course.

Volumes 2 and 3 have also been released. The course consists of both the textbook teaching and field visits. It is one of the most serious initiatives to instil the importance of protecting our environment in the minds of young children.

The topics for each book have been suggested by OICSD (Oxford India Centre for Sustainable Development – Oxford University) and peer reviewed by BNHS (Bombay Natural History Society).

This book is available free of cost to anyone wishing to roll out this curriculum anywhere in India.



October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Inauguration of Kalina Biodiversity Park, University of Mumbai, Kalina: with a stunning Arzan Khambatta art installation

### Project Cost Rs 2,20,00,000

The one-and-a-half-acre park located inside the Mumbai University campus at Kalina, took nearly nine months for completion and was financed by the CSR activity of HDFC Asset Management Company. The Rotary Club of Bombay was the ideator, NGO partner, and the implementing agency.

The garden is home to a Miyawaki forest, sensory park, urban bird habitat, butterfly garden, rejuvenated pond and art installation among others. The park was inaugurated on October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022, at the hands of Mr. Navneet Munot, Managing Director, HDFC Asset Management Company Limited. The vision for the park came from DG Sandip Agarwalla, who said, "Supporting the environment is Rotary International's new area of focus. Embracing this ethos, we have taken up multifarious projects in our District to catalyse a transformative change in the mind of youngsters; nurturing them to take ownership of the environment. Besides creating the bio-diversity park as a hub for nature education, we have developed a complete environmental curriculum with partners like Oxford India Centre for Sustainable Development and Bombay Natural History Society for school children."

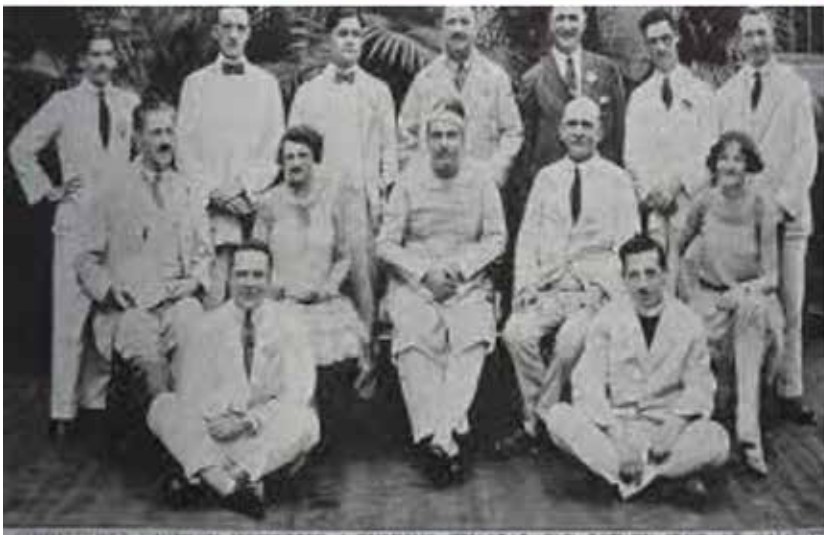

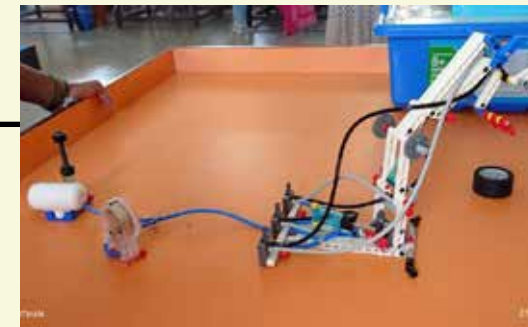

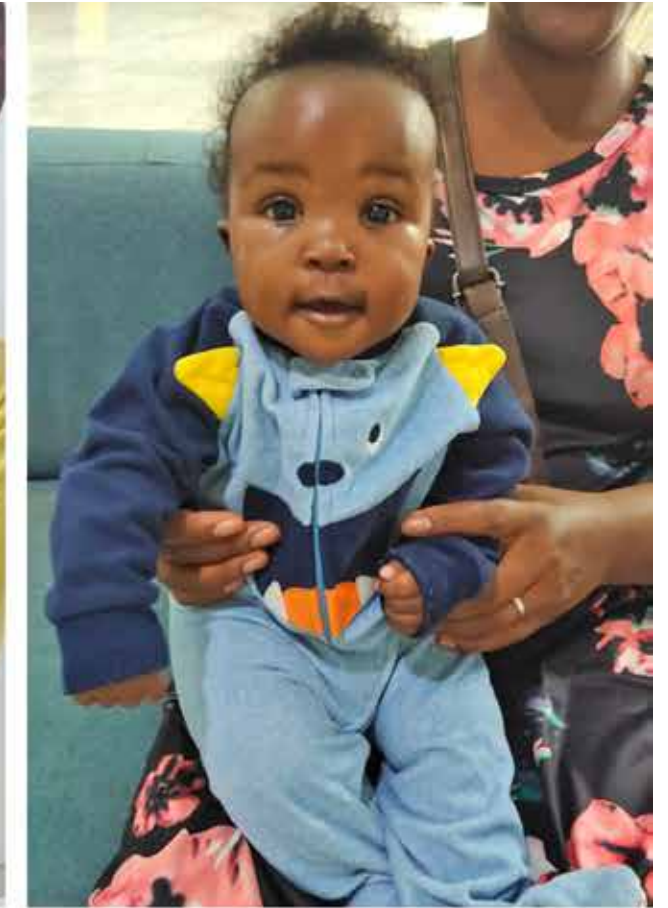

RCB transforms a village

As a part of its initiative to improve rural livelihoods, the Rotary Club of Bombay (RCB) along with the partner Chirag Rural Development Foundation has provided safe drinking water and solar power to the residents of Vanvasi village in Jawhar taluka of Palghar district, under the integrated village development plan.

Vincent Bhattacharya, president, RCB said, "I am delighted that we have manifested the dream of about 100-year-old Vanvasi village and its 132 houses. 25,578 litres of safe drinking water has been generated, also acres of agricultural land can be brought under cultivation, 176 KW of solar power has been generated and 14 educational facilities have been supported with sustainable energy."

After study, chairman, CRDF Committee stated, "We are very satisfied that this ongoing programme has provided much benefits, in some villages, a new well, a new boiler, concrete cementing full area, school in Vanvasi village, some upper primary schools were provided with computers as in Pimpri-Chinchwad, a solar powered community centre was built in Chavli village and sewing machines were provided in Khar and Kharapur Thane."

President, CRDF, Chirag Rural Development Foundation said, "The village of Vanvasi perched atop towering hills has been provided with a submersible solar pump in a village well, powered by a solar system to provide drinking water to the 132 houses. Another submersible solar pump in a nearby dam, which pulls water from 1000 metres of H/DPE pipeline to provide water to over 200 acres of farmland and 25 solar powered street lights have been strategically placed in the village to ensure security for the community."

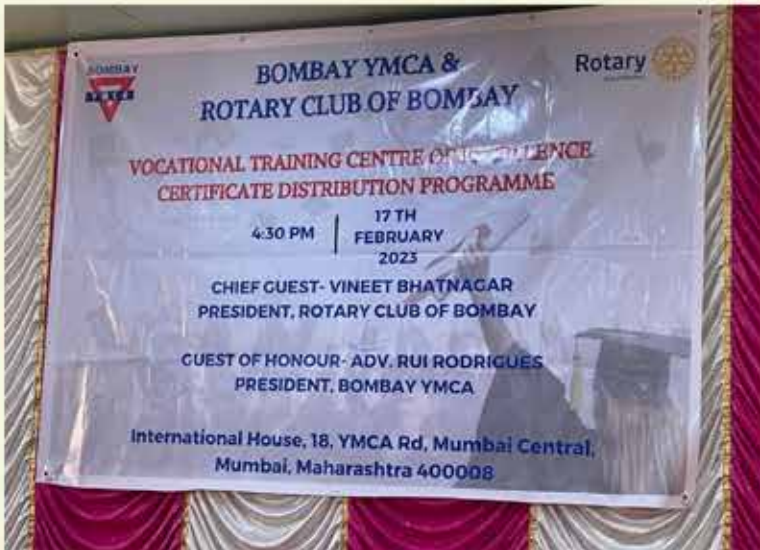
