PRESIDENT SATYAN'S VIBRANT YEAR

CELEBRATED BY THE ROTARY CLUB OF BOMBAY



Tuesday, June 24th, 2025, will be remembered as one of the most emotionally charged and memorable evenings in the Rotary Club of Bombay's recent history. Our annual Shukriya Nite proved to be an unforgettable celebration as President Satyan Israni delivered a deeply moving farewell address, celebrating not just the Club's achievements but the bonds that make our Rotary family truly special.

The evening commenced with a fellowship at 6 pm, setting a warm and convivial tone for the night ahead. As members gathered at the Trident, the atmosphere was filled with anticipation and celebration.

At precisely 7 pm, President Satyan called the meeting to order with the National Anthem, followed by a minute's silence for departed Club members – a solemn moment that reminded everyone of the continuity and legacy of our great institution.

Hon. Secretary Rhea Bhungara announced the week's birthdays, with President Satyan

extending warm wishes for "many more years of active Rotary service."

In a touching moment, PP Kalpana Munshi and Rtn. Naresh Jain felicitated President Satyan and First Lady Naveena, setting the stage for the evening's emotional journey.

IPP MANOJ'S MOVING INTRODUCTION

The evening's emotional tone was set beautifully by IPP Manoj Patodia, who delivered a heartfelt introduction that captured the essence of President Satyan's leadership:

"Remember the characters from the movie 3 Idiots? I have found one in this room and still looking for the other two. President Satyan is my Rancho. His broad smile, warm hug and firm handshakes not only spread positivity but also reassures everyone that all is well."

IPP Manoj's words resonated deeply as he continued: "Very few people had any doubt about how successful Satyan would be as the RCB President, but many thought that this young Rancho had so much in him as a human

being. In the face of personal crisis and losing close family members, not for a moment did Satyan drop the ball as a leader."

The touching tribute concluded with special recognition for First Lady Naveena, "She gave Satyan the critical support by managing everything that was required to be handled on the home front during the periods of crisis" and their son Samaksh for "enduring chatty RCB members during fellowships and assimilation lunches and dinners."

President Satyan then took the stage to thunderous applause, beginning with gratitude to IPP Manoj: "Thank you, Manoj for that wonderful message, your support and advice has meant a lot to me personally."

"This year, serving as your President, has been an immense privilege, a journey filled with challenges, triumphs, and an unparalleled sense of camaraderie. We've truly lived the Rotary spirit, and it's all thanks to each and every one of you."

In a powerful moment highlighting our Club's collaborative spirit, President Satyan invited PE Bimal Mehta and PN Manish Reshamwala to join him on stage, acknowledging the four-President collaborative model initiated by PP Shernaz Vakil in 2020-21 and continued through PP Vineet Bhatnagar and IPP Manoj Patodia.

One of the evening's most touching moments came when President Satyan called his core "Think Tank" to the stage – Hon. Secretary Rhea Bhungara, Hon. Joint Secretary Akhil Sanghi, and Hon. Treasurer Mehul Sampat.

"Since November 2021, the four of us have been involved in decisions, discussions and brainstorming about various aspects of our Club," he shared. "None of them have been on the OB before and it was a completely new experience for all of them, but they have taken on whatever task was given to them with full dedication and commitment. Thank you guys – you have been the best!"

In one of the evening's most emotional moments, President Satyan spoke about his parents with visible emotion: "When I was chosen to be President, both my parents were with me and they were extremely overjoyed and proud of me. In fact they were more confident of me than I was of myself and it is their faith in my ability that has carried me this far. I know they are watching me from up above and are showering their blessings on me."

The evening featured compelling audiovisual presentations of RCB projects that brought the year's achievements to life: "That was so heartwarming," President Satyan remarked after the projects showreel, before introducing the TRF projects showcase. "I now want to give you a glimpse of the various Club projects that you made possible through your support to the Rotary Foundation."

The infographics presentation displaying patient numbers, dialysis centres, dialysis cycles, paediatric heart surgeries, IVDP villages, adult literacy programmes, Bhavishya Yaan students, Ananda Yaan elders, and fund allocation charts drew audible appreciation from the audience.

The "Tuesdays at RCB" showreel and fellowship compilation brought back wonderful memories, with President Satyan noting: "Well, we don't only work hard, we also love to party hard."

He also recognised Rtn. Anand Dalal's Public Awards Committee for choosing worthy awardees including Shiamak Davar and Ananya Birla, and Mahesh Khubchandani and his attendance committee team for their hard work.

Special recognition went to the Fellowship Committee headed by Rtn. Ritu Prakash Desai, co-chaired by PP Vineet Bhatnagar and assisted by Rtn. Ptn. Kashmiri Dalal. With characteristic humour, President Satyan noted: "I think if any of us has PM Narendra Modi's ear, then once Dr. Jaishankar's term ends as Foreign Minister, we have a very capable replacement in PP Vineet Bhatnagar. Trust me his negotiating skills are next level."

Digital innovation: Rtn. Sushil Chandiramani for the new website and upcoming Club app, Rotarians Laxmi Maneklal and Pavit Chadha for social media management (achieving 11,000+ followers), and PE Bimal Mehta for the excellent quality Club roster.

Talwada milestone celebration

A significant highlight came with the Talwada land acquisition announcement. President Satyan paid tribute to PP Dr. Rumi Jehangir: “A huge salute to him for his dedication. Going every month since almost four decades to perform surgeries requires a different sort of commitment.”

The evening featured a special ceremony when President Satyan called forward Bhagwan Patil, Amit Patil, Sagar Gharat, and Jayesh Avhad from the Rotary Club of Palghar. He said, “It is only due to their assistance we could make this deal happen.”

President Satyan praised the entire office team: “When I took over from Manoj, most of our Rotary office staff was relatively new to Rotary and still learning the ropes. But over the past year, they have all stepped into their roles with aplomb.”

You made us feel we are not alone. This sense of belonging, this unwavering solidarity, this heartfelt support is what truly defines our Rotary family.”

He concluded with heartfelt thanks to “my friends in the Club and outside



it and my family – my parents who have been blessing us from up above, my sister and her family, my sister-in-law and her family, my in-laws, my wife Naveena and son Samaksh. I think Samaksh has attended more fellowships and meetings this year than several Rotarians.”

President Satyan’s final words encapsulated the evening’s spirit: “So for all this and more, Israni Parivaar would like to say, ‘Aap sab ka tahe dil se Shukriya!’ Shukriya from the bottom of our hearts for everything. Thank you, thank you, thank you to all of you for making this year truly unforgettable & memorable. Let’s continue to serve, to connect, and to inspire. Shukriya!”

The evening continued with the Club Awards ceremony, conducted by Joint Hon. Secretary Akhil Sanghi, recognising members with outstanding 100% attendance records and other achievements. 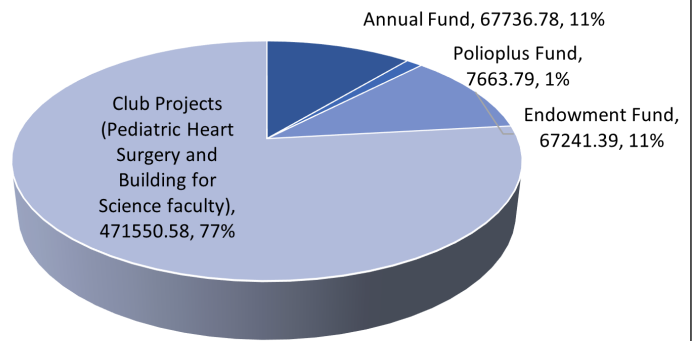

PE Bimal Mehta’s vote of thanks provided a fitting conclusion to the evening.

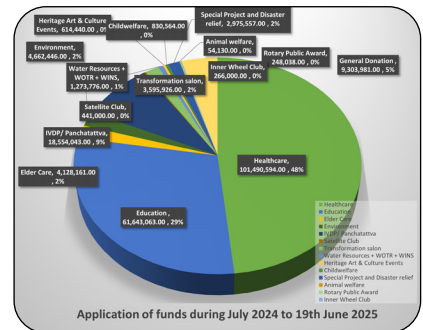
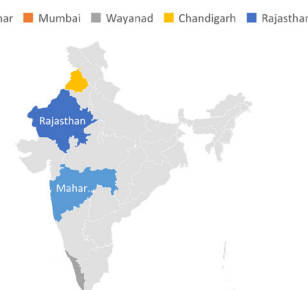
PRESIDENT SATYAN'S ACHIEVEMENTS 2024-25

7. Honoured as a **Vibrant Club**, the highest recognition awarded to a club by the district.

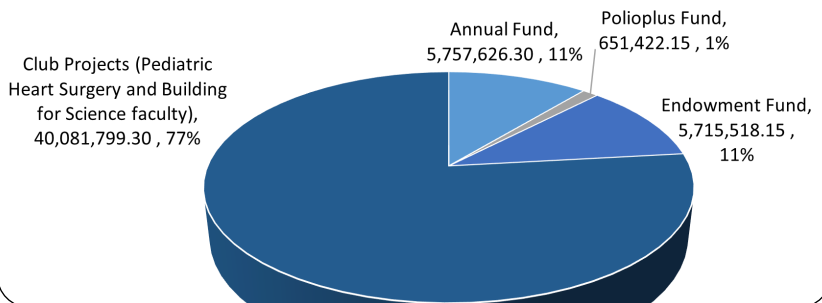
TRF FUNDS AS PER USD



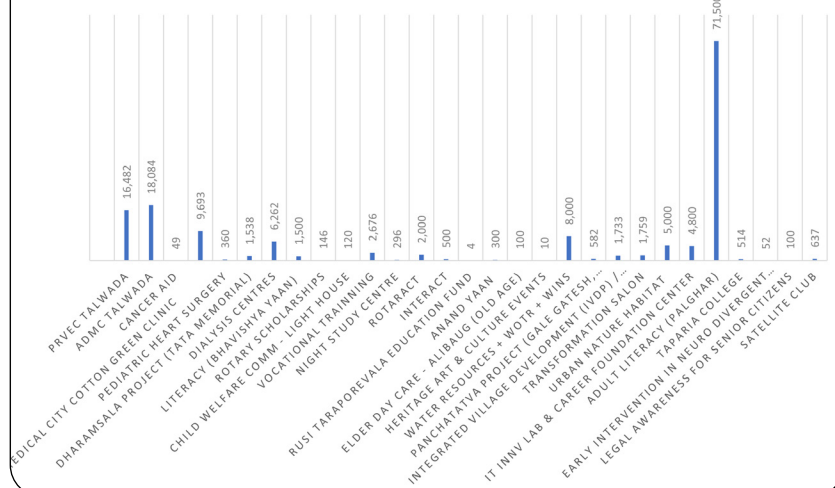
Project Reach For Year 2025-26

AN EVENING TO REMEMBER

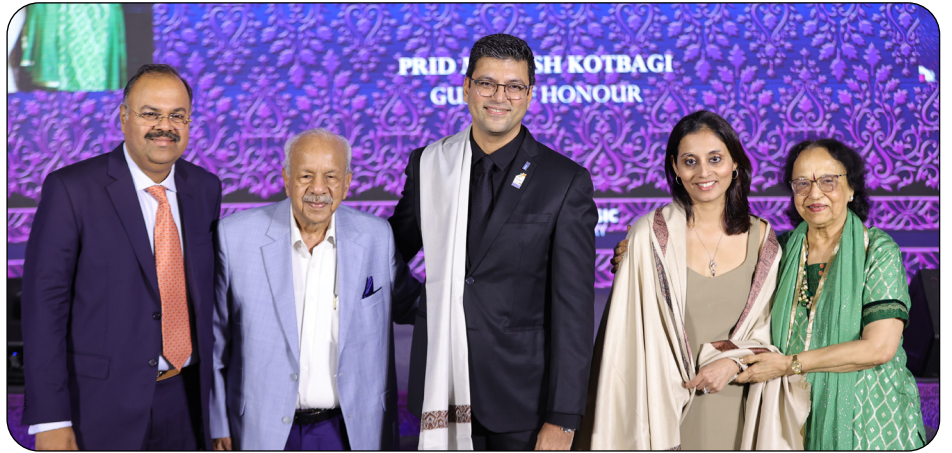

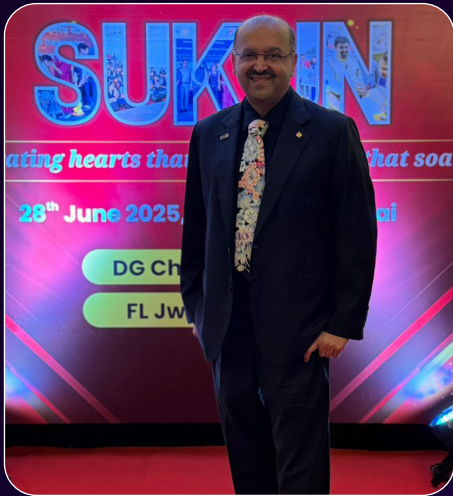


DISTRICT AWARDS

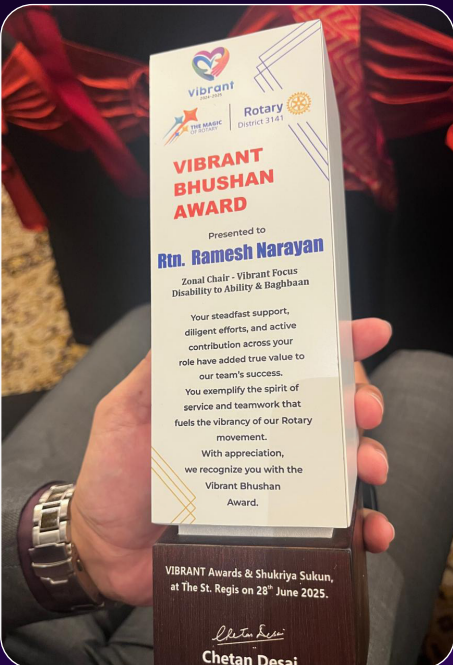

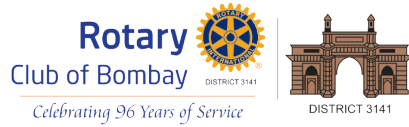
MATERIAL MODERNITY: LESSONS FROM MANIK BAGH

On June 23rd, 2025, an online session on Material Modernity was held at Bhavishya Yaan NMJ via Zoom at 11 am. Students from Grades 5 to 10 attended this informative session. The session provided useful information on materials, metals, and other elements used in architecture and construction.

A fascinating example shared was the 'fairy tale palace' of Manik Bagh in Indore, built in the 1930s. This ancient palace introduced an innovative and forward-thinking approach to design. It incorporated new materials and the latest construction techniques of its time. During the session, we explored the use of metals, alloys, tinted glass, reinforced concrete, and tubular steel in this architectural gem.

The discussion highlighted how these modern materials remain relevant today and the reasons behind using elements like copper tinted glass. It was a knowledgeable and engaging session that offered valuable insights into architecture and materials.
