Rotary Club of Bombay Arvind Jolly Award for Excellence in Sports to Ms. Jiya Rai

Thank you, Anisha and Arjun, for inviting us to this wonderful afternoon. As a father, we feel very honoured to share the stage with you, and we thank the Rotary Club for organising this function and awarding Jiya the Arvind Jolly Prestigious Award.

Jiya was diagnosed with autism at 2½ years old. After diagnosis, it was hard to digest, as no parent wants to hear that their child has an autism spectrum disorder. But truth is truth, and acceptance is the first step to overcoming the challenges ahead. At that age, her behaviour was often not accepted by society. We began facing challenges as parents, often having to justify our child's behaviour. But we noticed Jiya loved water. She would spend half an hour to an hour bathing, always ready to touch water, and she had a method to test it — floating toys, gauging safety. We didn't know it then.

'TIS THE SEASON

Coming to the H.T. Parekh Foundation — who are we? Whilst we proudly hold our name and lineage to the pioneer of India's housing finance industry and the founder of HDFC Mr. H.T. Parekh, as a Foundation, we have come a long way over the past almost 11 years in carving our own philanthropic identity.

We spent the first decade of our existence operating as what one would typically call a corporate philanthropy, implementing the large CSR mandate of our parent, the erstwhile HDFC Limited. Our journey as a corporate foundation started in 2014. In fact, I was the first employee, employee number one — right up to 2023, when the merger happened with HDFC Bank.

This journey laid strong foundation blocks for us on many fronts. Not only did we have a large CSR budget running into a few hundred crores every year, we also often struggled with what we called the problem of “too much”. Responsibly investing such large amounts year on year taught us some very invaluable lessons.

First, thinking strategically whilst doing philanthropy. While most people think strategically in the corporate world, there is also a way of thinking strategically in philanthropy. That approach is now widely used in the development sector and is called strategic philanthropy.

Second, identifying and supporting niche, underfunded areas. While thousands of crores of CSR money go into education,

healthcare, and livelihoods — which are very much needed — there are underrepresented sectors such as the arts and heritage preservation. We found our niche in the area of disability, a sector that is significantly underfunded. This became a secondary focus area for us over the last decade, and we have supported organisations such as Jai Vakeel and Ummeed, which have grown into ecosystem-level organisations within the disability sector.

Third, turning our attention to areas of established need. We observed that the eastern and north-eastern regions of India received very little CSR funding, despite needing support across human development parameters. We took a conscious decision to increase our investments there. From about 4% of our budget in the initial years, by 2023, our investments grew to 14%.

Fourth, building trust-based relationships with our partners, who are our hands and feet on the ground, as we are a grant-making foundation.

And fifth, and very importantly, being long-term supporters of development programmes — what is termed patient capital in the for-profit world — because that is when real change is seen on the ground.

All of this helped us build a philanthropic brand and identity, recognised as a mature and forward-thinking donor, a thought leader, and a funder whose approach was respected by peers in the sector. I was guided at...

Taking her to a swimming pool was a turning point. She was happy, and we felt comfort knowing no one would criticise us for her autism. Swimming became a safe space.

The defining moment came in 2014, when Jiya was six. Until then, she was not respected by society and was often called a “special child,” while we were “special parents.” At a school event that year, she won a gold medal and received applause from her classmates. That was the first instance we felt respect was possible. From that moment, we decided to pursue a longer journey for her, aiming for Olympics or the English Channel. By 2016, we began actively seeing that dream.

Rtn. Ptn. Anisha Jolly: So her competitive journey began at six, overcoming criticism with recognition.

Chief Rai: Yes. In water, every child plays the same way, so she was no longer labelled a “special child.” It was as if a divine signal told us to pursue swimming further.

Jiya has swum in many oceans — the English Channel, California, Sri Lanka, Arabian Sea. Which was the most challenging and why?

Chief Rai: Every swimming event was tough for Jiya in terms of approval. The English Channel is the most challenging due to temperature variations of 10–16°C, strong and unpredictable currents, and jellyfish. The solo swimming success rate is around 50%,

but for para-swimmers, it is only 2%. In 150 years of the channel's history, no one on the autism spectrum, male or female, had completed it successfully.

Before she could attempt it, applications were often rejected due to age or autism, including her first national event, the Porbandar Open Water Championship on January 5th, 2019. Despite initial rejection, we continued to watch the game as we didn't have tickets to go back home. While watching, one person came up to me and said that my daughter is a brilliant swimmer. I sighed and said that the organisation sees disabilities than talent. He was intrigued and asked me what had happened, I told him so and so. Then he called his team and saw if she can be given a waiver and she did, through the Swimming Federation of India (SFI), and Jiya was allowed to compete.

During the race, we saw many swimmers, well received, awarded. Her first national race was a five-kilometre open water swim. She led from the front, and the commentary announced: “Cap number 741, leading from the front, Jiya Rai from Mumbai.” She finished first, breaking records each year. By 2021, her five-kilometre time was 1 hour 20 minutes, down from 1 hour 28 minutes.

So for us, “No” is a lucky word. Every “no” in her life became a stepping stone to success.

So the English Channel was the ultimate challenge. How did she manage it?

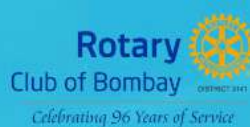

TEACHING ADULTS USING CREATIVE METHODS

THE INNOVATIVE TECHNIQUES OF ROTARY CLUB OF BOMBAY'S ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM

Training Prerikas for Effective Teaching:

One key aspect of the program is the training of Prerikas to conduct teaching sessions for adult learners. These Prerikas play a crucial role in delivering the curriculum

Classes tailored for beneficiaries:

The Adult Literacy program conducts classes for 50 beneficiaries in two separate batches, allowing for a more personalized teaching approach.

- The classes are structured to cover a variety of topics and skills that are essential for adult literacy.
- Weekly assessment are conducted to monitor progress and understanding.

The cost of making an adult functionally literate is approximately **INR 290** per adult only. This includes study material Kit consisting of various books and flash cards, stationery, final exam facilitation costs, graduation certificates and salaries to the coordinators/facilitators.

Over 1.5 lac adults have already achieved functional literacy, gaining a vocabulary of 700 words to read bus signs, newspapers, and bank documents and manage their daily arithmetical household accounts.

The Rotary Club of Bombay is conducting a pioneering initiative that hopes to eradicate adult illiteracy and promote adult education across India with implementing innovative techniques to teach adults using creative methods.

GOAL

This year we aim to educate an additional 61,500 adults in Palghar / Mumbai, with the ultimate goal of making Palghar completely (100%) adult literate.

FOCUSING ON THREE VERTICALS OF LEARNING

By incorporating these three verticals into the curriculum, the program ensures that adult learners receive a well-rounded education that equips them with essential skills for daily life.



1. ALPHABETS AND VOCABULARY

Prerika introduces a new alphabet that incorporates familiar items to enhance engagement and relatability. Each day, a new word is introduced and thoroughly discussed to facilitate better understanding. Prerika boosts confidence by encouraging beneficiaries to present their learnings.

2. NUMBERING AND COUNTING

Various counting games and activities are organized to make learning engaging and practical. For example, walking on the number line backwards and forwards to understand sequence and direction. Counting using sticks, stones, or leaves - grouping them in multiples of five to strengthen the concept of bundling and skip counting.

3. BASIC SKILLS TRAINING

Beneficiaries are taught how to use a calculator for basic arithmetic. They are also taught how to read calendars and are given guidance to improve their daily life skills and time management abilities.
